Old English (800-1066)



Ear tickler




- a. <u>Someone who tickles ears of</u> other people

- c. Someone who tells lies




'Bookless - this adjective could describe a student who comes to school without student's books. (Usually boys don't bother to bring books to school and it would be a good word to call them)
